What is the NSW Space Research Network (SRN)?

The NSW SRN is a university-led initiative of the NSW Government that aims to enhance the state's space industry capability by fostering collaboration between government, industry, and research organisations. It aims to position NSW to compete globally by leveraging funding opportunities and translating research into the space sector.

The SRN has been devoted to supporting students in advancing their careers and fostering meaningful connections and networks within the NSW Space Industry. To address this, we have established a state-wide student committee that will connect these student groups, enabling them to organise and host events on a scale not previously possible.

Moreover, you will be able to contribute to the growth of the space industry in NSW as the next generation of space professionals.



We are seeking active university students from NSW and ACT, graduating in 2024 and beyond, who are passionate about space and aerospace, willing to learn, and keen and proactive in their approach. We are looking for individuals who can lead and work well in a team.

A brief description of the nine available roles has been included below, with a more comprehensive role description that will be available on March 13th alongside the release of the application forms.

CO-PRESIDENTS (2)

The co-presidents serve as the leaders of the organisation and are responsible for overseeing all activities and initiatives. They collaborate closely with the executive committee and other members to establish and execute the organisation's vision and mission. Additionally, they serve as the point of contact for communication with the SRN and act as the Grievance Officer for internal issues. It is required that the two Co-Presidents come from separate universities.



SECRETARY (1):

The Secretary is responsible for maintaining the Society's non-financial records and ensuring that the Society's meetings and general management run smoothly. They serve as the primary point of contact for correspondence and ensure tasks are completed. They may also handle communication with potential and current sponsors.



TREASURER (1):

The Treasurer is responsible for managing the Society's funds and ensuring they are used appropriately. They oversee payment of invoices, hold petty cash, bank income, and maintain accurate financial records. The Treasurer also prepares financial reports for the SRN and executive committee.





EVENTS DIRECTORS (CAREERS & SOCIALS):

The Events Directors are responsible for organising and hosting events that benefit the members of the student community. They are tasked with expanding the community and ensuring that members' needs are met.



CAREERS EVENTS DIRECTOR (1):

The Careers Events Director is responsible for planning and executing events focused on professional development, networking, and job opportunities in the space industry. They collaborate with external parties, such as industry partners and Alumni, to create events that benefit members.



SOCIAL EVENTS DIRECTOR (1):

The Social Events Director is responsible for planning and executing events that foster social interaction and community building among members. They organise activities that promote a sense of belonging and enjoyment within the student community.



MARKETING DIRECTORS (2):

The Marketing Directors will be responsible for promoting the organisation's activities and initiatives by overseeing the management of the organisation's social media accounts, developing effective promotional materials, and establishing communication with relevant media outlets. Additionally, they will be accountable for documenting media coverage of all committee engagements and events, , as well as the production of any promotional media.



OUTREACH COORDINATOR (1):

The Outreach Coordinator will be responsible for fostering and maintaining relationships with all partnered universities, other organisations, and individuals within the space industry. The Coordinator will also be responsible for creating and implementing effective outreach initiatives aimed at promoting the organisation's mission and objectives.
